## Supporting Your Child's Success in Term 3

As we begin Term 3, this is a wonderful time to help students build strong habits and stay confident in their learning. Below are three simple but powerful ways families can support success at home.

### Using the Agenda Effectively

The student agenda is one of the most important tools for organization and independence.

Families can help by:

- Checking the agenda for homework, reminders, and upcoming deadlines.
- Encouraging students to write down homework, study plans, assessment dates, and questions to ask their teacher.
- Many teachers post important deadlines and dates on Teams! Often times, students need to be encouraged to check Teams regularly and write down those important dates. Many high school students still struggle with organization and could use a helping hand to create these healthy habits.
- Celebrating consistency! Even a quick "Nice job keeping this updated!" goes a long way. Helping students build this routine now sets them up for long-term self-management skills.

We are excited to share that the resource room has received new computers for students with computer accommodations. We will be meeting with students over the next weeks to help students navigate the new devices and become familiar once again with all the tools that are available to them.

## Accessing Extra Help

Every student benefits from extra support at different times, and we want them to feel confident asking for help. Here are ways families can encourage this:

- Ask your child to identify what they are stuck on: Is it a question, a concept, etc.
- Encourage your child to attend extra-help sessions. Fun fact: Did you know that every teacher has scheduled lunchtime remediation? This is a perfect time for your student to access one-on-one or small-group remediation. Math help is also available every Friday after school from 3:45 to 4:45 pm in room 244. The resource room is also open to all students every morning from 8:30 to 9:00 am and every day at lunch.
- Extra help is also available outside of school hours - Free online support is available to students through Learn Quebec and Allo Prof. Both platforms offer subject-specific support and some of the new cool features listed below.

    - Allo Prof has a new free feature which gives students access to online support from a teacher every weekday from 9 am to 8 pm and 9 am to 5 pm on Sundays.

    - Using their WQSB login, students can access ClassMarker through Learn Quebec to generate tests in math and science for grades 9-11, which self-correct to help students navigate their progress.
